

ADVANCED LEADERSHIP

TUESDAYS 8AM - 9AM

Advanced Leadership is leadership training with Pastor Josh Marocco, designed to equip and empower individuals for effective ministry within the church. This time focuses on developing advanced skills in organizational leadership, team building, and strategic planning, all within the context of church ministry. This time will also challenge and inspire students to step into greater levels of influence and effectiveness in church leadership.

INTRODUCTION TO THE OLD TESTAMENT

TUESDAYS 9:30AM - 12PM

Introduction to Old Testament is a historical-thematic survey of the Old Testament. It focuses on the content of the Old Testament, with emphasis on the cultural, historical, and geographical background to the text and the practical application of major Old Testament themes. This course requires students to read through the Old Testament.

COMPOSITION

TUESDAYS 1PM - 3PM

Composition introduces the student to focusing on the basic, fundamental skills of writing and grammar composition. Traditional worktexts will also be used to help develop students' analytical thinking skills, writing skills, research skills, and organization skills. Students will engage in various writing exercises and projects, designed to enhance their creativity and ability to effectively communicate ideas in both academic and real-world contexts.

LIFE & LEADERSHIP IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

WEDNESDAYS 8AM - 10AM

Life & Leadership in the Holy Spirit provides a dynamic exploration of living and leading under the guidance and empowerment of the Holy Spirit. Students will delve into biblical principles of Spirit-filled living, spiritual gifts, and their application in leadership and ministry. This class equips students to walk in the power of the Holy Spirit, transforming their lives and the lives of those they lead.



GROW

WEDNESDAYS 10AM - 12PM

Grow focuses on the principles and strategies of church growth and infrastructure development. Students will explore key aspects of building healthy, thriving ministries, including effective leadership, discipleship, and outreach models. Designed to equip leaders for growth at every level, this course provides the knowledge and skills necessary to cultivate sustainable expansion and kingdom impact.

EQUIP & EMPOWER

WEDNESDAYS 1PM - 3PM

Equip & Empower is designed to prepare and strengthen church leaders for effective ministry by focusing on equipping them with essential tools and empowering them to lead with confidence and purpose. Participants will explore topics such as servant leadership, team development, spiritual growth, and the practical application of biblical principles in leadership.

MENTORING

FRIDAYS 8AM - 9:30AM

Mentoring is time with Pastors Josh and Shannon Marocco, designed to provide personalized guidance and encouragement for individuals seeking to grow in their spiritual journey and leadership capacity. This class focuses on practical discipleship, biblical wisdom, and real-world insights to help students navigate challenges, build strong character, and develop their God-given gifts.

PASTORAL CARE

FRIDAYS 9:30AM - 12PM

This course equips students with the knowledge and skills to provide compassionate and effective pastoral care within the church and community. Emphasizing biblical principles and the heart of a shepherd, students will learn to care for others with empathy, wisdom, and sensitivity, fostering spiritual growth and emotional healing in those they serve.

SPRING: YEAR 1 COURSES

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MISSIOLOGY

TUESDAYS 1PM - 3PM

Missiology examines the study of missiology with a strong emphasis on evangelism and apologetics as foundational tools for fulfilling the Great Commission. Students will explore the biblical basis of missions, historical and contemporary strategies, and the challenges of engaging with diverse cultures and worldviews. This class prepares students to bring the message of Christ to the world with clarity, compassion, and conviction.

SCHOOL OF THE SUPERNATURAL

WEDNESDAYS 8AM - 10AM

The School of the Supernatural offers an immersive experience in learning to operate in the gifts of the Holy Spirit, with a focus on prophecy, healing, and deliverance. Students will be equipped with biblical foundations and practical tools for flowing in the supernatural power of God, learning to discern and activate spiritual gifts for ministry.

SPRING: YEAR 1 COURSES

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ESSENTIALS TO DEVELOPMENT

FRIDAYS 9:30AM - 12PM

Essentials to Development focuses on the core principles and practices essential for effective leadership growth. Emphasizing both personal and professional development, students will learn to identify their leadership strengths, overcome challenges, and cultivate a leadership style grounded in biblical values. Through practical tools and real-world applications, this course equips students to lead with integrity, confidence, and purpose, preparing them for greater influence in their communities and ministries.



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TEAM MEETINGS

TUESDAYS 9AM - 11AM

Team Meetings is where second-year students have chosen their ministry tracks to grow and develop in, playing an integral role in the ministry's work. In this time, students will be actively involved in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of various ministry initiatives, gaining hands-on experience in their chosen areas of focus. This time fosters both personal growth and practical application in real-world ministry contexts.

SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY I

WEDNESDAYS 9AM - 11AM

Systematic Theology I covers the methodology, history, and basic issues surrounding systematic theology (such as unity vs. diversity and continuity vs. discontinuity). This approach will be utilized to trace key elements of the Bible: God, angels, humanity. Commentary will cover some factors in these elements (God, triunity, mission of the Spirit, etc.).

HERMENEUTICS

WEDNESDAYS 12PM - 2PM

Hermeneutics introduces students to the issues and methods of biblical interpretation using the historical-grammatical method. It will address matters as presuppositions, historical context, grammar of texts, genre, word studies, and migrating the original message of the text into our current day world. Students will also develop the ability to apply sound interpretive principles to both Old and New Testament scriptures, ensuring accurate understanding and meaningful application of the Bible in today's context.

FALL: YEAR 2 COURSES

MENTORING

FRIDAYS 8AM - 9:30AM

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SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY II

WEDNESDAYS 9AM - 11AM

Systematic Theology II builds on the foundation laid in Systematic Theology I by delving deeper into the doctrinal themes of Scripture. This course explores key theological concepts such as Christology, salvation, the church, and eschatology, using the historical-grammatical method and systematic approach. Students will examine the nature of Jesus Christ, the work of salvation, the role of the Church in God's plan, and the future hope of believers, addressing important theological debates and perspectives.

HOMILETICS

WEDNESDAYS 12PM - 2PM

Homiletics teaches the principles of effective preaching, focusing on sermon structure, biblical exegesis, and practical application. Students will learn to craft biblically sound and culturally relevant messages while developing strong communication skills. Emphasis will be placed on voice modulation, body language, and connecting with the congregation. By the end of the course, students will be equipped to deliver clear, engaging, and impactful sermons.


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MINISTRY INTERNSHIPS


